



Skater Code of Conduct

As a skater, I will:

- Be courteous and respectful to all individuals – skaters, coaches, parents, and rink attendants
- Respect that the coaches are responsible for overseeing all skaters while on the ice
- Be accountable for my actions by bringing my full energy, attention and commitment to all skating sessions
- Be on time for all skating sessions and lesson times
- Wear appropriate skating attire (see Handbook for examples)
- Help keep dressing rooms clean and orderly, and place trash in the bins provided
- Keep safety in mind at all times, which includes:
 - Wearing a CSA-approved hockey helmet until I complete CanSkate Stage 5
 - For StarSkaters, wearing skate guards anytime I leave the ice
 - Getting up quickly when I fall down
 - Looking in the direction of travel when skating backwards
 - Not pushing, playing tag, or bumping into others or the boards
 - Not chewing gum or eating on the ice
 - Abstaining from the use of drugs, alcohol and tobacco products while involved with ALL Skate Martensville activities
- If I need to speak with my coaches outside of my lessons, I will address them when they are off the ice and not interrupt others' lessons.
- Attend as many lessons and as much ice time as reasonably possible
- Attend all mandatory practices in March (see Year-End Ice Show requirement)
- Respect other people's belongings and spaces, this includes, but is not limited to skate bags, lockers, and clothing.
- Refrain from damaging or tampering with (vandalism), taking (theft), or using anything that isn't mine without permission.
- Refrain from engaging in any form of inappropriate behavior, in accordance with Skate Canada's Code of Ethics, whether in person or online (including on social media). This includes, but is not limited to:

- misuse of authority,
